It would be great to allow for pedestrian entry from this direction at the east side of the enclosed area. Presently one has to walk or cycle all the way over to the western end to gain entry. For people living on "the far side" Holroyd Sportsground and adjoining open space represents the closest recreation space available and this should be allowed for. Generally speaking very happy with the suggested landscaping plan especially the revegetation project along A'Becketts Creek. <p>cover for protection from predators. Staged removal and revegetation from the upstream end should be employed. The vegetation in the channelised section of the canal described as "weed growth" in one section of the plan should be regarded as potential habitat for species including potentially Reed Warbler & other small bird species, frogs (including the Green & Golden Bell Frog) & aquatic insects such as dragonflies. The plant species concerned is absorbing nutrient & slowing down the flow of water, a decided advantage given the erosion that is occurring further down the creek. Screening of the channelised wall & retaining wall via smart planting of short / medium / tall species based on where in the slope they occur (shorter species upslope) would also be appreciated. Passive walking recreation & opportunities to improve fitness are also appreciated.
